New Narrow-Band working frequencies in the 2 300/2 400 – 2 450 MHz band

On several previous occasions the future of the 2 300 – 2 400 MHz band has been raised during working group meetings or conferences (i.e. Doc. 90/TS/C5.47 – Torremolinos - and more recently Doc. B 01, Newsletter 51, Vienna 2010 and Vienna 2013)

Now reality is catching up fast. The segment 2 300 - 2400 will be occupied by commercial services in many European countries within the next few years (WGFM-PT52).

In Denmark we will have to evacuate that part of the band by the end of 2015! Several other societies have now been warned about changes in their status in the band within the next 2 years!

It seems like we will need to move the present segment for terrestrial traffic and possibly find a solution to co-exist with amateur satellite traffic and WLAN, Microwave ovens, etc., within the $2\,400 - 2\,450$ MHz (ISM) segment?

As it has happened in the past when changes were necessary (2 304 > 2 320 GHz and 24 192 > 24 048 GHz) we hope a suitable solution for all countries can be found.
